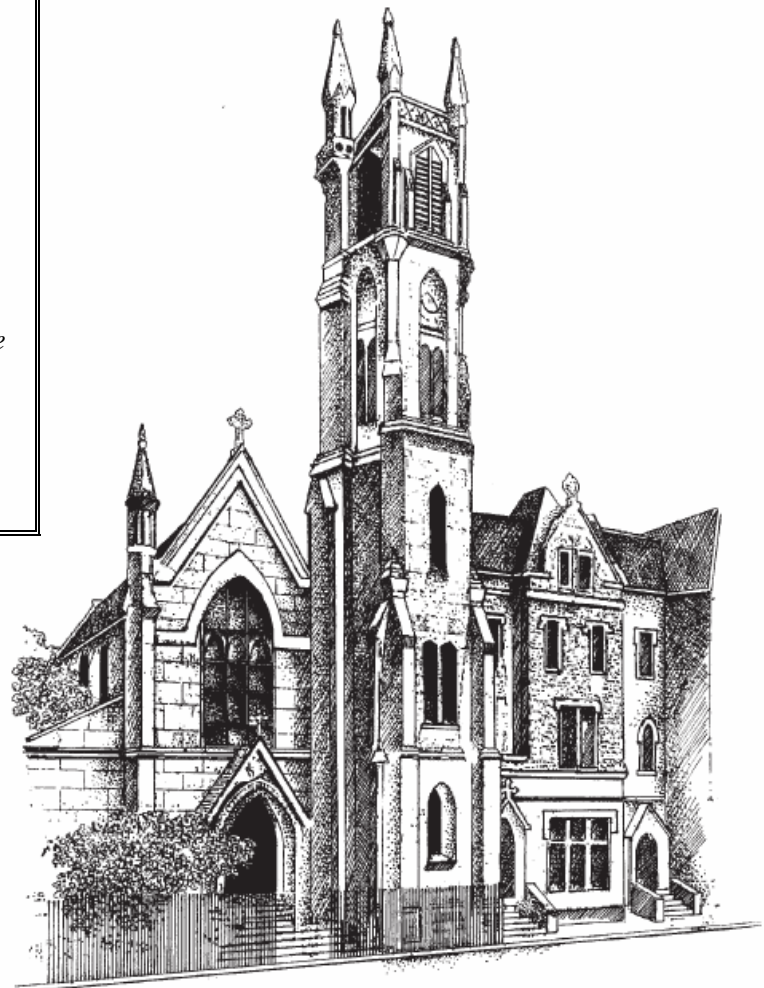

The Epiphany of the Lord

Theme/Call To Worship

On Epiphany (manifestation) Sunday, we celebrate how God made manifest his plan to save all people. With the birth of his Son, people of all nations who profess faith in Jesus are now coheirs to the promises offered by God.

Introduction To The Word

Is 60:1-6: As we hear in the first reading from Isaiah, Israel's tradition has a long history of prophesying God's plan to unite all people.

Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6: In this letter St. Paul talks about "the mystery made known to me by revelation." As Paul saw the growth and success of his mission, he was convinced that God's master plan for salvation history was no longer a mystery. To Paul, through faith in Jesus, all people were coheirs of God's gift of his Son.

Mt 2:1-12: The visit of the Magi as told by Matthew was told in such a way that it foreshadowed the reality of Jesus' upcoming public ministry. At the heart of the story reside two important messages, the inclusion of Gentiles into the community and the rejection of Jesus by the Jewish leadership. Rather than rejoicing at the prophecies being fulfilled, the religious leaders and "all Jerusalem" were "greatly troubled" because they were unwilling to let go of their rule over the Israelite people. By contrast, the Magi (i.e., the Gentiles) were "overjoyed" at the birth of the Jewish Messiah.

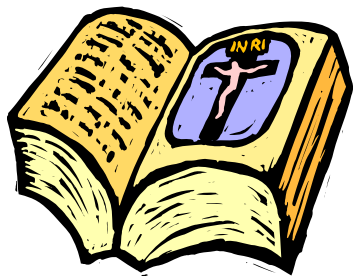
