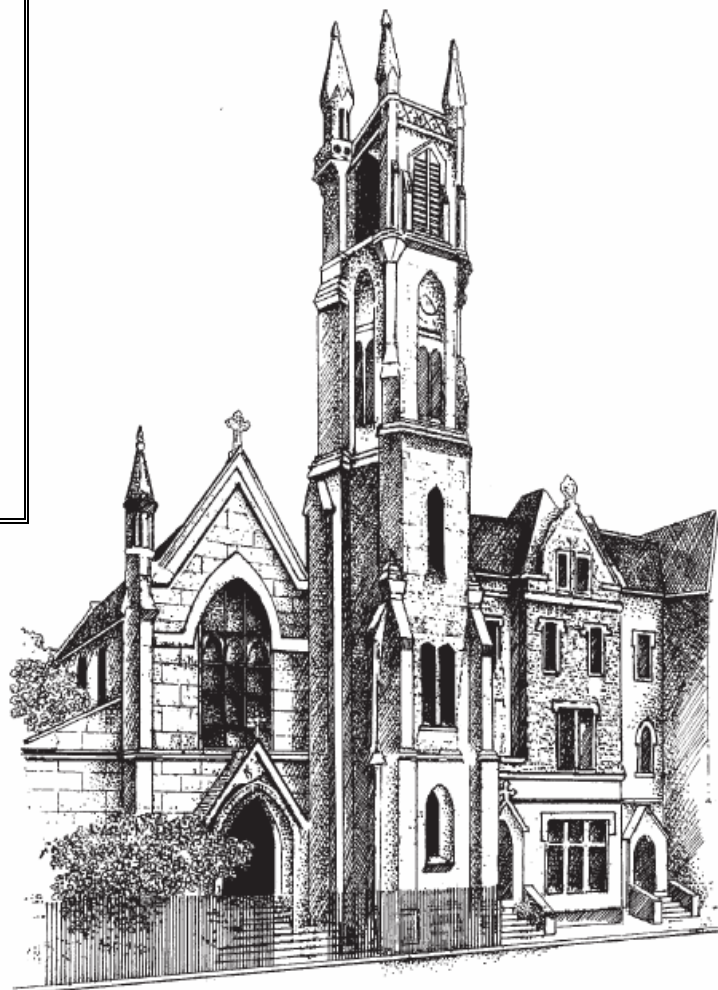

Theme/Call To Worship

Through faith we receive the ability to open ourselves to God's presence and gifts.

Introduction To The Word

Ez 2:2-5: In the first reading from the book of Ezekiel, we learn that when Ezekiel became a prophet, he understood that his mission would be a difficult one. "And whether they heed or resist – for they are a rebellious house – they shall know that a prophet has been among them."

2 Cor 12:7-10: In the second reading, St. Paul recognizes his own failings as he strives to spread the word of God, a recognition that enables him to see the power of faith in Christ. "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

Mk 6:1-6: In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of his amazement at the lack of faith of his own kinsmen. But he understood human nature, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own home."

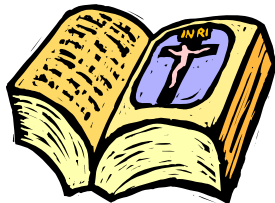
