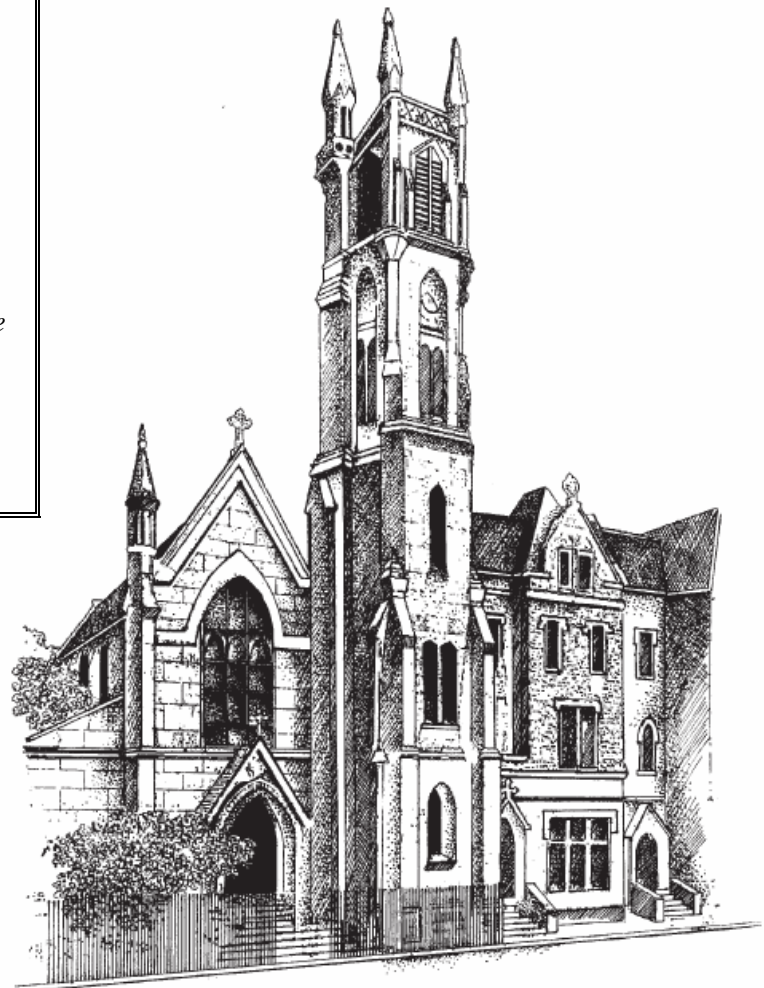

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Theme/Call To Worship

As disciples of Jesus, we are both shepherds and sheep: we respond to those in need as well as receive care when we are the ones in need. By this exchange of giving and receiving, we are no longer a scattered crowd, but a community of God's people.

Introduction To The Word

Jer 23:1-6: In this reading Jeremiah spoke of a coming Messianic Age in which God would "raise up a righteous shoot to David" and "appoint shepherds" who would bring back the scattered and misled sheep of God's flock.

Eph 2:13-18: As St. Paul continued his mission to the Gentiles he spoke of the unification of the Jewish and Gentile converts "for he is our peace, he who made both one."

Mk 6:30-34: Although it was Jesus' intention for his disciples to rest from their missionary work, he "was moved with pity" for the vast crowd that had assembled to hear his teaching. Just as Jeremiah had foreshadowed, six centuries earlier, the sheep were scattered and in need of a shepherd.

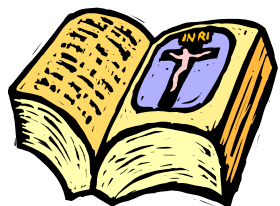
