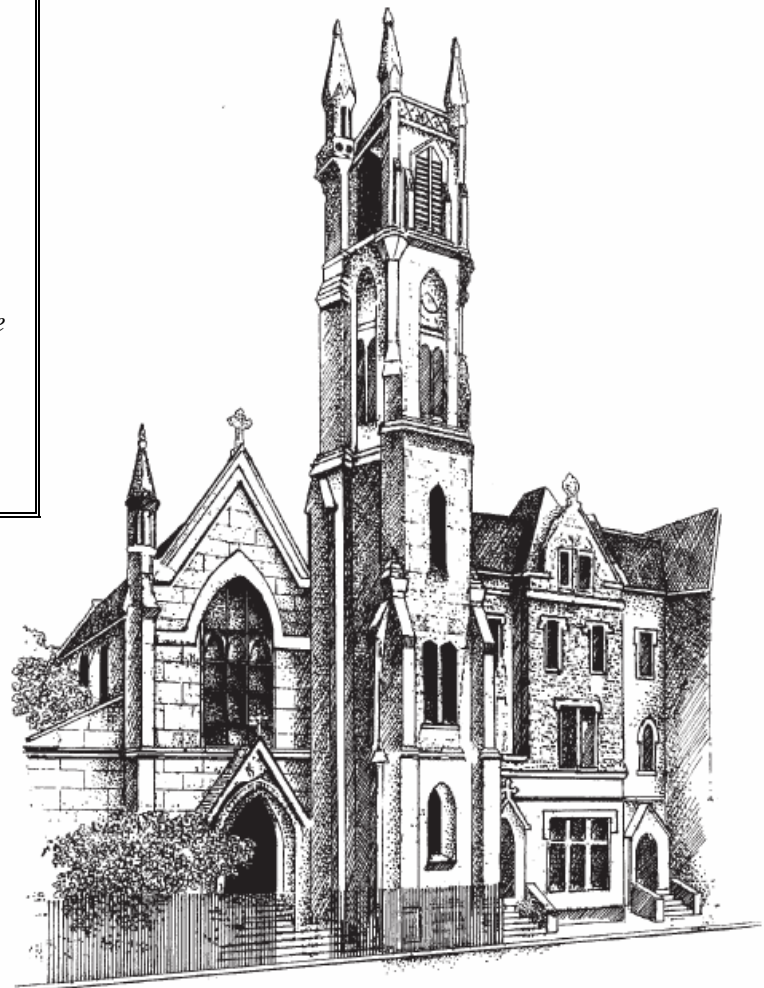

Introduction To The Word

2 Kgs 4:42-44: In the first reading from the Second Book of Kings, Elisha is able to feed a hundred people with twenty barley loaves and some corn. For thus says the Lord, "they shall eat and there shall be some left over."

Eph 4:1-6: St. Paul speaks to the Christians in the city of Ephesus of the importance of living "in a manner worthy of the call you have received."

Jn 6:1-15: Today's Gospel narrates Jesus' feeding of the five thousand, a miracle that clearly connected Jesus to Israel's prophetic tradition heard in the first reading from Second Kings.

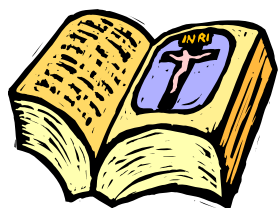

Whistler in The Frick Collection

June 2 through August 23, 2009

This summer The Frick Collection will present an exhibition dedicated to the colorful and often controversial artist James Abbott McNeill Whistler (1834–1903). Drawn entirely from the permanent collection, these works show Whistler's command of three distinct media and demonstrate his concern for the harmony of form, color, and composition. It is the first time in more than twenty years that these portraits, pastels, and prints will be on view together.

Permanent Collection

The Frick Collection includes some of the best-

known paintings by the greatest European artists, major works of sculpture (among them one of the finest groups of small bronzes in the world), superb eighteenth-century French furniture and porcelains, Limoges enamels, Oriental rugs, and other works of remarkable quality.
