Trinity Sunday

Theme/Call To Worship

Today we celebrate what our triune God has revealed to us throughout salvation history: united in being, our God calls us all to share in this divine relationship.

Introduction To The Word

Dt 4:32-34, 39-40: In the first reading, Moses recounts for the Israelites some of the defining moments in their Exodus from Egypt, their forty-year journey through the desert, and the wonder and power of God that brought them out of slavery.

Rom 8:14-17: In the second reading, St. Paul reminds the community in Rome that our ability to know and experience God as Father and our ability to know ourselves as "joint heirs with Christ" was a gift of the Holy Spirit.

Mt 28:16-20: The Gospel is taken from the final episode in the Gospel of Matthew the commissioning of the disciples. In his final command, Jesus directs the disciples to "make disciples of all nations," and to teach them "to observe all that I have commanded you."
